





#### **Letters From Max**

#### Taken from the Favorite Recipes and Recollections

Dear Legislators:

Many of you have asked for my oyster stew recipe. Are you sure that you want to suffer



through this? The recipe is hard to get. It started at the oyster bar in the Grand Central Station in New York City.

The ingredients are very simple — once you find the right oysters. The right oysters are essential. Oysters from different areas are as different as Idaho and Maine potatoes. No oyster larger than "extra small" is

proper but this grade will vary from place to place so exploration will be necessary.

#### The recipe is very simple:

1 pint of oysters
1 pint of whole milk
1/2 pint of whipping cream
2 tbls. Butter
1 tsp. Worcestershire sauce
Dash of celery salt
Dash of paprika
Salt and Pepper to taste

#### Now for the procedure:

In a double boiler at moderate heat cook all ingredients, except milk and cream. Stir frequently for about five minutes until the oysters show signs of being cooked. Pour the milk in first then the cream or it may curdle. Stir frequently and cook until the oysters float on top. Then it should be ready to serve. Better taste it. Good isn't it!

#### **Max Yost Lace Cookies**

One egg, well beaten
3/4 c. sugar
1/4 pound of butter, melted
1 tsp. flour (no foolin')
1/2 c. chopped cashew nuts
2 tsp. vanilla

Mix ingredients thoroughly in sequence as listed. Bake 1/2 teaspoon dabs on aluminum foil on cookie sheet at 350 degrees for seven minutes. Sounds simple doesn't it? Let cool and peel off foil.
